Infinity is Forever

"The LORD will reign forever and ever." -Exodus 15:18

When I registered for Mathematics 101 (Statistics and Computers) during my Freshman year of college, I hoped the lower number of that course would equate to less rigor and skill required. I was wrong! Math has always been the most difficult subject for me in school. This course challenged me in more ways than you could imagine, and fortunately, by the end of the term, Professor Jackson felt that I had progressed enough in my understanding of the subject to grant me a "C" for the term. Thanks be to God!

One of the most challenging concepts for me, mathematically and theologically, is the concept of infinity (forever). We affirm that God exists forever before all of creation and will be with us forever and ever, yet we wonder how to define "infinity." Interestingly, while I was in my final year of Union Seminary, I was invited to teach Religion to a class of 4th and 5th-grade students at St. Christopher's Episcopal School in Richmond. One day, I asked the class to close their eyes and imagine life before the creation of our planet long, long ago — to the beginning of time. Consider, I told them, the world before God created the creatures of the land and sea, before any humans walked here, before the birds and flowers. Now, describe what you see. Their response — we see complete darkness!

I then asked — who created the darkness? Who existed even before the world that we know was created? Their answer — God, the infinite divine presence who was, is, and always will be God, who dwells even in the darkness. The promise that God reigns forever and ever is comforting in a world where so many changes are not consistent and dependable.

Infinity is a more straightforward concept to understand if we remember this wonderful truth — though our minds cannot explain how anything can be forever, our hearts embrace the truth of God's everlasting love and presence in our lives and that is Good News!

What are "Masterpiece Moments?"


We are doing a series this year called "Masterpiece Moments," where we will have specific events each quarter that combine a faithful reflection time with a hands-on creativity experience.

Where did the idea for "Masterpiece Moments" come from?

Over the last few months, I have been reflecting on how our faith is an action, not simply just a state of being. I have spent some time shrinking the world around me so I can have time and bandwidth to give back to the areas that bring me joy and sustain my faith.

How did creativity get into the mix?

I am an accountant and a glorified "left-brainer." When it comes to creativity, I usually end up a little short. Those genes skipped my generation. However, I am a very tactile learner. I grow as a person best when I can touch, taste, and feel my way through. I spent time reflecting on how I could pull in my desire for touch, taste, and feel into my daily faith life. I knew I wanted to do something new and different, and that is where the idea of intersecting creativity and faith began.



Why is the word "Masterpiece" used as part of the title?

Ephesians 2:10 (NLT) says, "We are God's Masterpiece. He has created us anew in Jesus Christ, so we can do the good things that He has planned for us long ago." God is the ultimate potter, and we are the clay. He molds us, shapes us, forms us, and sets us apart. We are God's Masterpiece, and God sends us out so we can shape and form others by sharing our faith. We are to live an active and moving faith in God by being God's hands and feet in this world.

Are you developing this series yourself, or is there committee involvement?

While ultimately this was my idea, the adult ministries committee has spent time discussing these reflection moments and we intend to have specific events each quarter that will provide an opportunity for our community to experience where our faith and creativity intersect. I will be the one responsible for designing the events under the reflection and advice of the adult ministries committee.

Are these events open to the community?

The intent of these events is that they are open to anyone and everyone, members or non-members of our church. Bring a friend! Invite someone new to join you.

What and when is the first event?

The first one we are doing is "Masterpiece Moments: Guided Yoga and Meditation with Jesus." It will be on Saturday, March 8th, from 9:00 to 11:00 am in the Fellowship Hall. The event is free, and it is open to 13 years or older.



An "Adventure in Faith" Brought Us to This Day

The planning, construction, and settlement of our magnificent sanctuary and church campus on Garrison took place over 12 years, from 1949 to 1961. In 1961, at the request of the Memorials Committee, Elder Charles F. Daniel documented the historical achievement and, citing pastor Dr. Harry M. Moffett, called that season of the church, "An Adventure in Faith."

"We started our program with no fixed goal but to expand our program and work for a greater witness to God. It seems that at each step of the project, from the earliest studies to fulfillment, we have been led by faith and now have accomplished deeds that were never dreamed of at the beginning," Dr. Moffett was said to have remarked to church officers.

"One or two hundred years from now, families will be still worshipping in our new church. Few may recall who the preachers and people were who built it," Dr. Moffett continued, "but this they will not be able to forget: that in the middle years of the twentieth century, when all the world was in turmoil with suspicion and threat, there were still people who had faith in God and in the future—faith great enough to build a great church. Our new church will be our witness for generations to come."





This is the legacy we enjoy today, made possible by the foresight, faithfulness, and planning of those who were the church before us. We honor their investment in "a greater witness to God" through our personal and collective support and involvement in worship, service, mission outreach, education and discipleship, and tangible witnesses to God's abundant love. Today, we express our gratitude for the Great Cloud of Witnesses and plan our church's future legacy. Our church continues to nurture the faith of the youngest souls who will be bathed by the waters of Baptism.

In the 1960s, Pastor Dr. Moffett praised the church's achievement and remarked, "We will have much more than a new building and grounds. We will have joy, unity, and spiritual enrichment beyond anything we can now foresee. There awaits us a new life of worship, a new experience of joyful service, and a new fruitfulness in our witness."


